WHEREAS, it is important for Floridians to understand their role in protecting manatees, especially in light of near record-setting manatee mortality; and

WHEREAS, manatees face a very high risk of extinction due to human related threats including the loss of warm water winter habitat; and

WHEREAS, raising public awareness through exhibits, school and community programs, and videos and brochures, increases appreciation and conservation of the species; and

WHEREAS, cooperation among Florida's public, private and governmental organizations is vital to saving manatees, and organizations and individuals must continue working together for the long-term survival of the manatee; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Charlie Crist, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend greetings and best wishes to all observing November 2008 as *Manatee Awareness Month*.
